Homework Policy

Rationale

- To promote positive home / school communication. •
- To maximise the benefit of homework to the child's learning.
- To have consistency throughout the school with regards to the amount of homework given.

Aims

- To develop skills and self-discipline that will be of benefit to children in order to enhance learning.
- To reinforce work done in class it allows for revision and practise.
- To develop study skills and to assist in establishing an appropriate routine for children in doing their homework.
- To promote consistency and a similar approach to homework across all classes.
- To encourage children to become independent learners and to revise / reinforce / finish work • that has begun in school.
- To strengthen links and communication between home and school-Homework- "A bridge not a battle"

Guidelines

- Regular homework will be given in all classes Monday to Thursday, with no homework on Friday. • 6th Class may be given homework on Fridays.
- Infant classes may be given reading homework. All other classes will have a balance between • oral, reading and written work over the course of the school week.
- From time to time throughout the year children will be requested to carry out research for project work at home in their own time.

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Time spent on homework each evening-

- Senior Infants (10-15 minutes). •
- First Class (20 minutes).
- Second Class (20-30 minutes). •
- Third Class (30-40 minutes). •
- Fourth Class (45 minutes).
- Fifth Class (1 hour).
- Sixth Class (1 hour-1 hour 15 minutes).

Homework Journal

Classes will use the homework journal from First Class onwards.

Checking Homework

- Homework will be checked by the class teacher.
- Homework should be of an acceptable standard for that child's ability. •
- Credit is given for effort as well as achievement.

Parents / Guardians

- Parents have an opportunity to liaise with teachers daily through the homework journal and also at the parent - teacher meeting.
- Parents can help establish a routine for doing homework by having a set place, time and • preventing interruptions and distractions.
- Parents should check and sign the journal each day and ensure work is done to an acceptable • standard.
- Parents should notify in writing if their child is having difficulties with any element of their homework.
- Pupils must take responsibility for ensuring they have the necessary books and requisites for full completion of homework.
